The OSU Academic Medical District is a bold vision of treatment and research and is the largest ever health care investment in downtown Tulsa. The district encompasses multiple city blocks, anchors downtown's western boundary and will feature state-of-the-art facilities and services including a Veterans Hospital, Oklahoma Psychiatric Care Center, OSU Medical Center and a new research facility.

Originally founded in 1943, the OSU Medical Center is the teaching hospital associated with OSU Center for Health Sciences.



The current hospital is 556,000 square feet with 235 patient beds and is the only hospital in downtown Tulsa.

OSU Medicine operates 10 primary care and specialty clinics in close proximity to the hospital in the Academic Medical District.





OSU Medical Center has started the first phase of a \$175 million hospital expansion and improvement project that will enhance patient care in northeastern Oklahoma. The nearly 180,000-square-foot expansion will include eight new surgical suites, a pharmaceutical research lab and a sky bridge connecting OSU Medical Center to the VA hospital across the street. This project is transformative for downtown Tulsa and northeastern Oklahoma, and demonstrates OSU's commitment to educating and training physicians, and providing quality medical care.
