Tribal Medical Track Opportunities

• Students can assume leadership positions with the Native American Students of Osteopathic Medicine (NASOM) at OSU-COM/CN, and the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM).



• Students complete a guided, Tribal health-focused research project during their first and second years of medical school.

Clinical Experience

• Prior to the second year of medical school, students may shadow a Tribal physician for two weeks.

Enhanced Clinical **Training**

· Limited enrollment translates to more hands-on training opportunities and one-on-one focused instruction for students.

Internships

 Students complete at least two sub-internships at a primary care residency site early in their fourth year. The subinternships can serve as residency auditions.

Selective Rotations

 Optimize skills in residency training and beyond, students complete at least three selective specialty rotations as identified by OSU College of Osteopathic Medicine medical education staff.
