



Tribal Medical Track Opportunities

Leadership

- Students can assume leadership positions with the Native American Students of Osteopathic Medicine (NASOM) at OSU-COM/CN, and the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine (AACOM).

Research

- Students complete a guided, Tribal health-focused research project during their first and second years of medical school.

Early Clinical Experience

- Prior to the second year of medical school, students may shadow a Tribal physician for two weeks.

Enhanced Clinical Training

- Limited enrollment translates to more hands-on training opportunities and one-on-one focused instruction for students.

Sub-Internships

- Students complete at least two sub-internships at a primary care residency site early in their fourth year. The sub-internships can serve as residency auditions.

Selective Rotations

- Optimize skills in residency training and beyond, students complete at least three selective specialty rotations as identified by OSU College of Osteopathic Medicine medical education staff.
