

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING 3+1 Program

This Memorandum of Understanding ("Agreement") establishes the 3+1 Program between Cameron University (CU) and Oklahoma State University - Center for Health Sciences (OSU-CHS), College of Osteopathic Medicine dated June 28, 2019.

OSU-CHS seeks to admit students who desire to become primary care physicians in rural and underserved Oklahoma. The 3+1 Program allows students to complete their pre-doctoral medical training in seven years by completing three years of undergraduate education at Cameron and four years of medical education at OSU-CHS in its Rural Medical Track (RMT). Students apply to the 3+1 Program in their sophomore year of college. After successfully completing the first year of medical school and meeting the academic requirements, Cameron University will award an undergraduate degree to students accepted in the 3+1 Program.

To qualify for the 3+1 Program, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be a resident of Oklahoma;
- Have a strong desire to practice primary care medicine in rural or underserved
 Oklahoma:
- Be a full-time student (minimum of 12 semester credit hours for fall and spring semesters) enrolled at Cameron University;
- Major in Biology (Cell and Molecular Concentration);
- Overall grade point average (GPA) of at least a 3.5 and Science GPA of 3.5;
- Have completed 45 or more credit hours toward a bachelor's degree at the time of application to OSU-CHS;
- Meet the academic requirements specified in *Exhibit A*. Courses are encouraged to be taken at Cameron University, except those earned as concurrent enrollment or received AP credits.
 - Science GPA will be calculated with the course subject categories defined by (American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine Application Service)
 AACOMAS;

- Submit a complete application for admission through the American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine Application Service (AACOMAS) by February 28 of sophomore year;
- Submit a complete secondary/supplemental application for admission by March 30 of sophomore year;
- Submit two letters of recommendation: One letter from a Cameron University Advisor and one letter from a physician (D.O. preferred);
- Conduct a personal interview with the OSU-CHS Admissions Committee during the spring semester of sophomore year.

Students who meet these requirements will be eligible for the 3+1 Program. Students must check the appropriate box on their secondary/supplemental application to indicate they have met the 3+1 Program requirements. Following an in-person interview, the Chair of the Admissions Committee or Director of Admissions will notify applicants of the Admissions Committee's decision by May 1. The applicant will either be granted provisional early acceptance into the 3+1 Program or be invited to apply for admission in a later application cycle as a traditional applicant.

In order to maintain continued acceptance into the OSU-COM 3+1 Program, provisionally accepted students must satisfy the following requirements:

- Maintain an overall grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.5 and science GPA of at least a 3.5;
- Take the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) during their junior year and score a minimum of 492 before matriculation to OSU-COM;
- Complete all remaining undergraduate coursework required for the approved 3+1 degree plan during their junior year;
- Request in December of sophomore year and May of junior year transcripts from Cameron indicating all academic requirements outlined in *Exhibit A* have been met;
- The Chairperson of the Department of Agriculture, Biology and Health Sciences or designee will provide documentation indicating the student has met the academic requirements by the end of the student's junior year; and
- The Chairperson of the Department of Agriculture, Biology and Health Sciences or designee will provide documentation stating any student violations or conduct issues on the student's record in December of sophomore year and May of junior year.

After completing the first year of medical school at OSU-CHS and prior to enrolling in courses for the second year of medical school, 3+1 Program students must:

 Apply for graduation to Cameron University by April 1 to be included in the spring commencement ceremony. Student will not officially graduate in May until degree is conferred in the summer but can participate in ceremony; and • Submit a final, official transcript indicating all coursework completed from OSU-COM after their first completed year of medical school and submit to Cameron University.

OSU-CHS reserves the right to periodically review the Agreement and recommend changes as deemed necessary. In the event OSU-CHS makes recommendations, CU will have thirty (30) days to accept or reject the proposed changes. Agreements will be reviewed annually for any updates on degree plans and major for approval. Agreed-upon changes to the Agreement will become effective for the incoming undergraduate class for the following academic year.

For any current application cycle, Cameron University may make adjustments in academic plans on a case-by-case basis with the mutual agreement of both parties, to include the Assistant Dean for Enrollment Management at OSU-CHS and Department of Agriculture, Biology and Health Science Chair at Cameron University.

Both programs have the right to terminate the Agreement at any time with thirty (30) days' notice.
