- Be a permanent resident of the United States;
- Achieve a minimum of a 3.5-grade point average (GPA);

- Medicine; Complete a baccalaureate degree before matriculation to OSU-CHS College of Osteopathic
- Meet the academic requirements specified in Attachment 1;
- (AACOMAS) application by February 28; Submit an American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine Application Service
- Submit a supplemental/secondary application by March 30;
- Complete at least 500 hours in a health-related setting at the time of application;
- Be a first-time applicant to the Guaranteed Interview Program.

East Central University Academic Requirements for the GI Program

1. Pre-requisites for application

- Major in Biology or health adjacent concentration such as Biology-Health Sciences; EHS-Public Health or Molecular Biology.
- Required listed courses are strongly encouraged to be taken at ECU, except those taken as modality and syllabi requirements as set forth by CEP-OSHRE requirements including facethrough transfer. All courses must follow the Oklahoma Course Equivalency Program (CEP) concurrent enrollment during high school, AP credits or before matriculation into ECU to-face lab time training expectations and other career relevant requirements.
