Dr. Jin Seo is an associated professor at Rogers State University. I received a doctoral degree at the University of Texas at Austin. I demonstrated a mechanism by which Mouse Mammary Tumor Virus interacts with its host transcription factor to maximize viral production. Since I moved to the UT Southwestern medical center for postdoctoral training, I have been working on adipose stem cells, obesity, diabetes, and aging using multiple model organisms including fruit flies and mice. These studies result in the identification of skinny genes, anti-diabetic genes, and longevity genes. Furthermore, I truly enjoy mentoring undergraduates in my lab and teaching undergraduate courses at RSU.
